- **Representation and Leadership:**

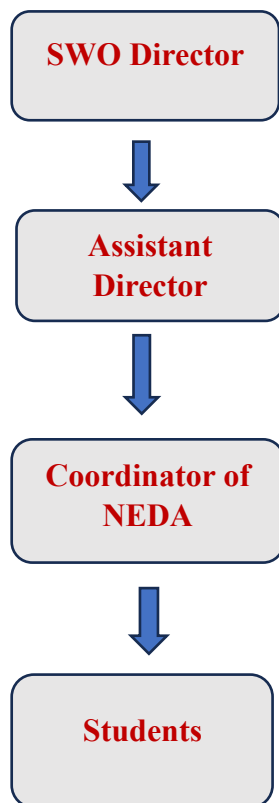
Ensure the representation of North Eastern students in various college committees and decision-making bodies.
