Introduction

The Rotaract Club is a global network of young adults who are committed to making a positive impact in their communities and the world. Sponsored by Rotary International, Rotaract clubs provide opportunities for young people, typically aged 18 to 30, to develop leadership skills, engage in service projects, and foster international understanding. Rotaract club was established on 2021 at St. Francis de Sales College

The name *Rotaract* is a combination of “Rotary” and “Action,” reflecting the club’s focus on bringing together youth and young professionals to take action on local and global challenges. Rotaract clubs are active in over 180 countries, with more than 10,000 clubs worldwide.

2.Establishment and Purpose:

The **purpose** of a Rotaract Club is to provide young adults with the opportunity to make a positive impact on their communities and the world **Community Service:** To organize and participate in meaningful community service projects that address local needs and global challenges, improving lives and fostering a sense of social responsibility.

6. Leadership Development Classes

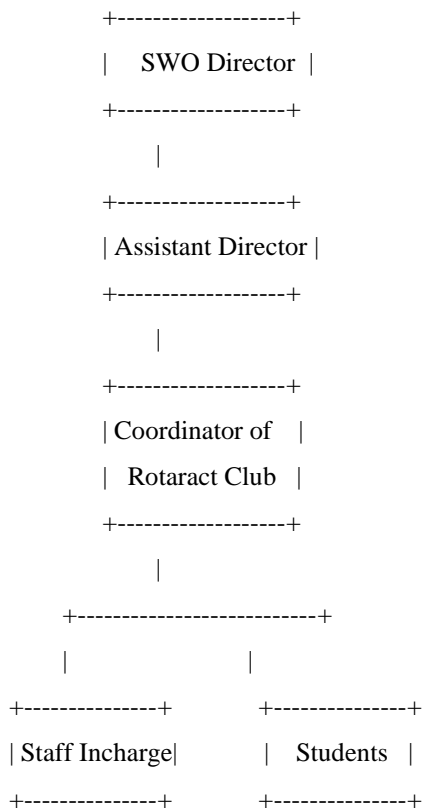

Explanation of the Structure:

1. **SWO Director:** The highest authority in the structure, responsible for overall supervision and management of the Rotaract Club's strategic vision and execution.
2. **Assistant Director:** Supports the SWO Director and takes over responsibilities in their absence. They may oversee specific operations or projects within the club.
3. **Coordinator of Rotaract Club:** Responsible for day-to-day management of club activities, coordinating events, and ensuring all members are actively involved.
4. **Staff Incharge:** Manages specific areas like event organization, membership engagement, or service projects. They work closely with the coordinator and other team members.
5. **Students:** Active members of the club who participate in activities, contribute to projects, and play an essential role in executing the club's initiatives.

- Head (President/Club Chair):** Leads the club, sets goals, represents the club externally, and ensures operations run smoothly.

□ **Vice President:** Supports the president, oversees projects and membership, and helps lead the club.

□ **Treasurer:** Manages finances, budgets, and fundraising efforts.

□ **Director of PR:** Handles the club's public relations, branding, and social media.

□ **Director of Service Projects:** Leads community service initiatives and projects.

□ **Committee Heads:** Lead specific committees (e.g., event planning, membership), ensuring successful execution of tasks.

Staff Members: Participate in club activities, contribute to projects, and support the club's overall mission.
