
He started his speech by introducing what is research, types, literature review, research methodology, statistical tools, text analytics, interdisciplinary research, ethics & research integrity to our budding minds.


OUTCOME OF THE PROGRAM:

Students were listening carefully, when resource person asked few questions they answered with interest.





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Detailed Report

Objective: To Overcome stress during pandemic

The orientation session on Emotional Wellbeing and Coping during the Pandemic was conducted on 7th June 2021 for both teaching and non teaching faculty. The session began with welcome and prayer by Prof. Victoria. Resource person was introduced by Prof. Rosaline.

Prof Mamatha was the resource person.

Prof. Mamatha, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Psychology-PG, St. Francis De Sales College is specialized in Clinical Psychology. She actively involves herself in counselling and also mentoring students. She engages herself in research works and has presented papers at national and international Conferences. She has also been active in Publications of research works. She has been invited as a resource person for guest lectures in various institutions addressing students and parents. She has been successful in guiding students for competitions, research works and publications.

Emotions are psychological states brought on by neurophysiological changes, variously associated with thoughts, feelings, behavioural responses, and a degree of pleasure or displeasure. The emotions identified were happiness, sadness, disgust, fear, surprise, and anger. According to the book "Discovering Psychology" by Don Hockenbury and Sandra E. Hockenbury, an emotion is a complex psychological state that involves three distinct components: a subjective experience, a physiological response, and a behavioural or expressive response.

Our resource person had described that Emotional well-being has been defined as an overall positive state of one's emotions, life satisfaction, sense of meaning and purpose, and ability to pursue self-defined goals.

"the ability to practice stress-management techniques, be resilient, and generate the emotions that lead to good feelings"

"A positive sense of wellbeing which enables an individual to be able to function in society and meet the demands of everyday life; people in good mental health have the ability to recover effectively from illness, change of misfortune."

Our resource person has explained that mindfulness means maintaining a moment-by-moment awareness of our thoughts, feelings, bodily sensations and surrounding environment. She quoted that mindful eating cycle, it is started from why, when, what, how, how much, where and ended again with why. Why denotes, why do i eat; when explains; when do i want to eat; what says, what do i eat; how shows, how do i eat; how much says, how much do I eat; where stand for, where do I invest my energy .

She narrated that thinking has been classified into two types i.e., rational and irrational.

Rational thinking is the ability to consider the relevant variables of a situation and to access, organize, and analyse relevant information.


Irrational thinking is cognition, thinking, talking, or acting without inclusion of rationality. It is more specifically described as an action or opinion given through inadequate use of

reason, or through emotional distress or cognitive deficiency.

At an end of the session faculty have asked few questions such as how to control anger, how to behave with others whey they were showing negative attitude, etc.,

Our resource person clarified gave the solutions against their questions. The session was useful and informative to the faculty members. Ultimately Principal appreciated the resource person. The session ended with vote of thanks by Prof. Roshini.


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


Books and labels should match and he insisted to have ID scanning for entry and exit, and to have a bar code reading machine and link that to the software of library – LIB software. And also insisted to maintain gate register and to prepare daily, monthly, yearly statements of gate registers of both faculties and students.

He also told that seating arrangement should be separate for both UG and PG students. And informed the library staff to place all the records in a separate table on the day of peer team visit. And told the library staff that they should have good knowledge regarding the place of each book. And insisted them to maintain books in DDC serial wise. And informed to place the ladder in a visible zone.

And appreciated reprography services we have in our library. And enquired regarding the ILL (inter library loan) for sister concerns. And informed to add few more books for rare collection. And told that collage is nicely maintaining all sort of books like SC/ST etc.

When coming to digital library he informed the librarian to check the working condition of the system before the peer team visit.

Resource person felt very happy with the system followed by the collage in maintaining the library, above are the few things which he wanted the institution to check before peer team visit. And told the main librarian to present a presentation using PPT on the visit of peer team.

7. Career Guidance Information: to provide the useful career related news appeared in the daily and magazines.



8. Suggestion Box and timely response: To improve the library services.

9. Inclusion of sufficient Information about the library in the college Hand books/ prospectus.


10. Internet facility to staff and students.

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Electronic Publishing of Student Work

Ordinarily, when students write essays or research papers for a course, they write for an audience of one: the instructor. But teachers who have persuaded students that they are writing for a broader audience have found that students take the work more seriously and devote a great deal more effort to it. Creating a system of on-line publications for your course, or for your department, can have a tremendous impact on student engagement with scholarly work. On-line publishing also creates opportunities for student collaboration, and for students to take a more direct and responsible role in the learning process than they otherwise might. Another thing that makes electronic publishing valuable is that it exposes students to the stylistic constraints and opportunities of the new digital media. Already, a considerable portion of this nation's business, scholarly, and personal communication occurs through e-mail, the World Wide Web, and private networks of computers. A number of important periodicals, such as *Salon Magazine* and Microsoft's *Slate*, exist primarily or solely on-line.

The range of electronic publishing techniques you use in your course depends largely on the technical skills, resources, and imagination of you or your class. Students have performed the following with considerable success:

- ***Multimedia in-class presentations:*** A student uses a presentation program to supplement a standard spoken presentation with images, charts and graphs, or sound.
- ***Essays in the form of World Wide Web pages:*** While even a traditional text essay might be posted for comment, the best web essays will make use of the Web's unique ability to incorporate multimedia elements.
- ***Web teaching units for your class or other classes:*** Students can become teachers by sharing their research and analysis with the class or with an outside audience (including secondary and primary school classes).
- ***Web exhibits:*** By emulating the form and rigor of museum and library exhibits, students can produce a classroom and community resource on their topic.
- ***Collaborative projects:*** All of the above projects lend themselves to collaborative work by groups of students.
- ***Classroom archive/library:*** Over the years, a digitally savvy course might accumulate an excellent library of digital student essays, teaching units, exhibits, and dialogues.

THE OUTCOME OF THE ACTIVITY:

E-resources have a prominent role to play in supporting higher education and in fulfilling educational objectives. E-resources are rich source of information for those students who want extra learning materials in addition to their regular classroom activities.



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

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REPORT ON LITERURY OF GENIUS

INTRODUCTION

The SFS college library committee-knowledge center conducted a documentary session on the life of Mr. Arun kolatkar. The event name was "life of a literary genius". The aim of the programme was to introduce the students into the marvelous world of poetry and to create more authors among the student community to lead the society into a new renaissance.

BACKGROUND

The concept of genius, in literary theory and literary history, derives from the later 18th century, T.V.F. Brogan argues that "genius" is a middle term in the evolution of the idea of inspiration and poetic ability from a belief in an external source (afflatus, or divine infection, and poetic phrenzy, or divine madness) and an internal source (imagination and the subconscious). However, the concept became nearly identical with poetic madness and divine madness in later Romanticism.

Literary genius is a multi-layered aptitude that consists of many unique cognitive, affective, perceptual, motivational, interpersonal, and state-dependent attributes, including the challenging of orthodox thinking, fertility of ideas, compulsive discipline and hard work, tolerance of ambiguity, innocence of perception

Documentaries deal exclusively with facts and real-life events. The main purpose of a documentary is to inform and educate. Despite their differences, both feature films and documentaries use cinematography and follow a script.

A documentary film or documentary is a non-fictional motion-picture intended to "document reality, primarily for the purposes of instruction, education, or maintaining a historical record".

ABOUT THE DOCUMANTARY

Mr. Arun kolatkar was born in Kolhapur, Maharashtra, where his father Tatya Kolatkar was an officer in the Education department. He lived in a traditional patriarchal Hindu extended family, along with his uncle's family.

He has described their nine-room house as "a house of cards. Five in a row on the ground, topped by three on the first, and one on the second floor. "The floors had to be "plastered with cow dung every week".

He attended Rajaram High School in Kolhapur, where Marathi was the medium of instruction. After graduation in 1949, much against his father's wishes, he joined S. B. College of Arts, Gulbarga, where his childhood friend Baburao Sadwelkar was enrolled. His college years saw a "mysterious phase of drifting and formal as well as spiritual education", and he graduated in 1957.

In 1953, he married Darshan Chhabda (sister of well-known painter Bal Chhabda). The marriage was opposed by both families, partly because Kolatkar was yet to sell any of his paintings.

His early years in Mumbai were poor but eventful, especially his life as an upcoming artist in the Rampart Row neighbourhood, where the Artists' Aid Fund Centre was located. Around this time, he also translated Tukaram into English. In Marathi, his poetry is the quintessence of the modernist as manifested in the 'little magazine movement' in the 1950s and 1960s. His early Marathi poetry was radically experimental and displayed the influences of European avant-garde trends like surrealism, expressionism and Beat generation poetry. These poems are oblique, whimsical and at the same time dark, sinister, and exceedingly funny. Some of these characteristics can be seen in Jejuri and Kala Ghoda Poems in English, but his early Marathi poems are far more radical, dark and humorous than his English poems. His early Marathi poetry is far more audacious and takes greater liberties with language. However, in his later Marathi poetry, the language is more accessible and less radical compared to earlier works. His later works Chirimiri, Bhijki Vahi and Droan are less introverted and less nightmarish. They show a greater social awareness and his satire becomes more direct.

Bilingual poet and anthologist Vilas

Sarang assigns great importance to Kolatkar's contribution to Marathi poetry, pointing to Chirimiri in particular as "a work that must give inspiration and direction to all future Marathi poets".

CONCLUSION

The programme was conducted to all the streams of under graduate students, to make aware of the poets, their life, struggles, and their achievements.

The programme ended on scheduled time and the event got tremendous support from library committee.

The essential element of a good documentary is simply, the story. The audience must have an intellectual and emotional tie to the film. A well edited film allows for a more unprejudiced approach. This documentary brought uniqueness of the poet and motivated the students in cultivating the habit of writing.



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





A form of literary criticism, book reviews are written opinions about a particular book. They can take many forms. Book reviews can be brief or long. They can critique and/or summarize the book. They can be written by readers or professional book reviewers. Reader reviews tend to be more personal, focusing on the individual reader's experience while reading the book. But since readers can have such widely differing views of the same book, it is valuable for all involved when a book has a variety of reader reviews available. If you have written a book, or if you would like to, here are three reasons why book reviews are vital to writers and readers.

Book reviews make books a known quantity. They decrease the risk to readers that a particular book will be not what they had in mind at all. In fact, book reviews help potential readers become familiar with what a book is about, give them an idea of how they themselves might react to it and determine whether this particular book will be the right book for them right now. Book reviews save readers time, prepare them for what they will find and offer them a greater chance of connecting with a particular book, even before they read the first page. Book reviews give books greater visibility and a greater chance of getting found by more readers. On some websites, books that have more book reviews are more likely to be shown to prospective readers and buyers as compared to books with few or no book reviews. Book reviews also help amplify your book's reach among book clubs, bookstores, blogging communities and other opportunities to gain attention from new readers.

CONCLUSION

The purpose of the activity got filled as many students and faculties has participated in the activity and made the programme achieve a tremendous success. The activity was well received and appreciated by participants. It motivated the participants to read more and more books and improve their knowledge.


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One aim of the campaign is to see more students read, and that is why every LIBRARY on this platform goes towards the books, and ensuring they reach the children for whom they are

OBJECTIVE:

- **Web OPAC** is the Online Public Access Catalogue which allows users avail the services of the library using Internet.
- The OPAC software enables the librarians to catalog different genres of books and maintain its database online.
- It allows users to search books on parameters such as title, author's name, volume, and keywords with mere clicks.
- All the faculty members was been oriented the usage of web opac.

INTRODUCTION:

The concept of Web OPACs is the recent origin and it is serving as a gateway to the resources not only held by the respective library but also to the holdings of other participating libraries without local collection but going, beyond further to regional, national, international levels. It allows users to interact with documents stored on computers all over the world and makes easier

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
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referred as 'web cat' and as an 'Information gateways'. It can support protocols such as telnet, HTTP., FTP, and Gopher and support the file and document like Portable Document Format (pdf), (HTML), etc.

Features of WEB OPAC:

The important features of Web OPACs are:

1. It is accessible through the internet.
2. It is possible to search independently by Author, Keyword, Title or Year.
3. Displays complete bibliographic information as appeared on reprints.
4. Features of traditional OPACs such as storing bibliographic and sometimes full-text databases; providing direct access to a library's bibliographic database by means of terminal or PC; search result in readily understandable form; reference help, etc.
5. It has the ability to use hypertext links to facilities navigation through bibliographic records.
6. Linking to full text when available is there.

Although, the library operates a web-based OPAC, majority of the users access library OPAC only within the library premises. It was also clear that both undergraduate and postgraduate students used manual catalogue more than the OPAC to access library resources due to the fact that majority lack the basic information searching skills, power outage and network failures among other problems. To overcome all these issues mainly the awareness/orientation programme on Web Opac Services was been first conducted to the faculty members.

The programme was ended successfully after the live demonstration.

THE OUTCOME OF THE ACTIVITY:

1. It is world wide and all the time accessible.
2. The status of any book may be known as book issue or not etc. the status of an acquisition order may be available at both staff and public terminals located throughout the library.
3. It is possible for users to send reprint requests immediately by e-mail.
4. There is no limitation of time and space for searches of any document of not only his/her library but also any networked library.

OBJECTIVE:

- A book talk is a short presentation about a book with the goal of convincing the students to read it.
- Book talks will encourage the students to expand their reading tastes.

INTRODUCTION:

A book talk is a short (30 second - 2 minute) speech designed to encourage someone to read a book, giving an idea of plot, characters, or themes of the book, but, unlike a book report, does not summarize the whole plot or give away the ending or major plot points. In other words, no spoilers!

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MEANING - A book talk is a short presentation based on a book that a student has read. It is a book commercial for the book, in which the student's goal is to convince

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their peers that they need to read it! In a book talk, they will be engaging their listeners by piquing their curiosity. They are making their book appear fun, exciting and suspenseful. A book talk is not a formal presentation. This book advertisement is an authentic and persuasive sharing of their book.

Parts of a Book Talk

A book talk has three main parts – the hook, the content and the cliffhanger.

- *The Hook* – To start their book talk, students should grab their audience's attention right away! They could do this with a powerful quote from the story. Students could introduce the main character or vividly set the scene for the class. They could also hook their audience by asking a question. Let them get creative!
- *The Content* – Next, they need to share what their book is about. This is where they provide the details from the novel and summarize the plot. They could even share a brief excerpt from the story.
- *The Cliffhanger* – Finally, students need to end their book talk with a cliffhanger. They should leave their audience wanting more, but they need to be careful to not give away the ending!

Book Talk Tips

- Keep it short! To keep their audience's attention, a book talk should only be a few minutes.
- Engage the audience by asking if anyone has read the book. If they have, allow them time to share their thoughts on the book.
- Encourage your class to record any books that interest them on their to-be-read list.
- Create a book recommendation board in your classroom. Grab a free book spine template to use in this blog post about [building a reading community](#). Have students write the book's title and author on the book spine and hang them up in the classroom.


THE OUTCOME OF THE ACTIVITY


Classroom book talks can be a very powerful experience in your classroom! They get kids reading – *really* reading. In order for students to be able to talk about a book (and answer questions), they need to be very familiar with the story.

- Reading is contagious! When they know that their peers are reading and what they are reading, it entices them to pick up a book more often.
- Builds speaking skills. Oral speaking can be scary for students. Giving them the opportunity to informally present in your classroom will help them gain confidence.
- Book talks are beneficial for the audience too! Students are practicing how to be an attentive audience. They will learn how to participate in a discussion and how to ask appropriate questions.
