The Desalite Nature's Club took up the initiative of creating awareness among the students about the hazards of usage of plastic in day to day life. The purpose of this awareness campaign is to 'Make a little change, say no to plastic'. The members of the Nature's Club along with few other volunteers brainstormed and proposed the idea of creating a video and circulating to the Desalites and uploading on various social media platforms. The volunteers selected few instances from everyday life where plastic is largely and invariably by many. They chose the scenarios of usage of plastic for take away food in canteen, use of plastic water bottles, use of disposable cutlery etc and prepared a video by themselves playing few roles in the video. This short video was circulated among the Desalites as a means to create awareness in them.

The students also indulged creatively in preparing posters and exhibiting the same on 11 May 2023. The posters were also based on the same topic and students got an opportunity to view these posters during the break hour. Students displayed their artistic skills by creating colourful and meaningful posters, conveying the message of the hazards of plastic usage.

According to statistical records, an average human being consumes about 2% of micro plastic almost every day in various forms. This can be avoided by stopping the usage of plastic containers for food, water and beverages. A significantly small measure of plastic has also been found in the blood of human beings. The posters intended to bring knowledge in students about the various grades of plastic and the difficulty and the impossibilities in recycling certain types of plastic. This has now become a global concern and largely the concern of SFS Campus as well.

Outcome: Students and faculty realized the hazards of plastic usage, especially disposables used to eat or carry food and drink water.

Plants are the greatest resource to get healed and recharged. Desalite's Nature Club in association with the Faculty Enrichment Committee and the Department of English, organized a workshop on 'Plants that Heal' in the new auditorium of the college, on 16 February 2023 at 12:30 pm.

In this workshop Dr. S. Kumar, a well- known writer, health adviser and a publisher of health magazines shared his thoughts on 'Plants that Heal' with the students and professors He shared his thoughts on plants like Sanjeevini growing in the lap of nature. He ga detailed explanation on the herbs that are needed to improve one's health on a day-to-day

of the programme, he introduced to the audience the nature and benefits of several medicinal plants that can be found and used at home. He also detailed on the beneficial plants that can be found in the neighborhood which we generally tend to ignore. He made everyone feel convinced that a healthy life can give infinite peace.

Dr. S. Kumar was also accompanied by the Director of Health from the Education Department, Mr. Manohar. He brought various herbs from an NGO's nursery, identified them with their common names and created awareness about their medicinal value. He explained the reasons for the increase or decrease in blood pressure and showed the audience the herb that can heal and control blood pressure related complications. He introduced a miracle plant called Madhunasini that can control blood sugar. The faculty were given a leaf of Madhunasini to be tasted. To everyone's surprise, later, when they were given a dose of sugar to taste, it was not sweet at all. The live demo made everyone understand the power of Madhunasini that can control blood sugar. Audience realized that they were ignorant of so many common plants that have the capacity to heal lives.

The session then shifted its focus on the health issues faced by women. In a stressful world, women face lot of health-related trouble. Women are the true asset of every family. If they are healthy, the family will be healthy. So, the guests stressed on the importance of paying attention to women's health.

Overall, it was a very interactive session where several students asked doubts about certain diseases and were informed of the herbs that heal them. The professors also talked about home remedies and proved that the solution to several health issues can be found in everyone's kitchen.

After the program, Dr. Madhuramozhi V and Prof. Veena N, members of the Nature Club, took Mr. Manohar to the herbal garden in the college. He was impressed on seeing the name boards under each plant and the number of varieties identified with their common and botanical names. The guests gifted the college with 30 varieties of herbs to be planted in the Herbal Garden. Later, the plants were carefully planted by the gardener in the herbal garden. They are sure to save lives. The success of the workshop was realized when some of the faculty ordered herbs from the nursery run by the NGO and the books on herbs published by them.





Brochure for the session on 'Plants that Heal'








Plants that heal session in progress



The objective of the Program: To create awareness among students on the need to save rivers

Report:

Azim Premji University conducted Rivers of Life exhibition in its campus from 2 to 16 November 2022. The focus of the event was to show that rivers are the cradles of life, civilizations and ecosystems. It also focussed on the exposition of conflicts and threats to rivers. There were stories shared on river revival and various associated movements.

Understanding the importance and the influence of the event on students, Desalite Nature's club visited the exhibition on 10 November 2022 in collaboration with the Department of Humanities. There were

There were 35 students from V semester BA along with Prof.Deepa, from the department of Humanities and DNC coordinator, Dr.Madhuramozhi V. We left the college in the morning and reached the venue at 10:00 am. During the day long exhibition, students explored stunning photo-exhibition of rivers across India. They got an opportunity to interact with noted experts through talks and workshops. During the conversations with experts, they learnt about river folklore and its culture.

There was also a demo session on the impact of dams on the environment and on the lives of those living along the banks of such rivers. The students observed the demo and raised queries to the experts. It was a very interactive session. During the photo exhibition, the students were accompanied by an experienced climate change professional who explained the details to the photos exhibited. There were pictures on the glory of rivers on one side and on the opposite, the fate of polluted rivers due to human activity and mindless waste disposal into rivers. There was also a book release event by one of the volunteers of the Narmada Bachao Andolan movement. Students listened to shocking stories of oppression from those in power on the people living on the banks of Narmada. There were panel discussions as well. Students got to listen to experts like Shristee Bajpai of Kalpavriksh, Ashok Biswal of The Nature Conservancy, Ashish Kothari of Kalpavriksh, Rahul Ram of Indian Ocean movement, Kewal Singh Vasave, Rehmat Mansoori, Panna Lal Patidar, Giridhar Guruji from Narmada Valley.

The exhibition left the students spell bound and they realised the importance of saving rivers which are the source of life.

The outcome of the program: The Exhibit was of high importance to students as they are the future custodians of the rivers around us. It inspired and motivated them to do a project of that kind in our college as well. They wanted to speak about the natural features that are in danger like mountains.

To create awareness and to pay respects to those died in the gas tragedy, Desalite's Nature Club, St. Francis de Sales College, Electronic City, organised MIME in the Quadrangle from 10.00 AM to 10.30 am. A team of I Semester UG students volunteered to perform Mime. They explained the dangers of industrialization through their act and explained how it impacted common men and farmers.
