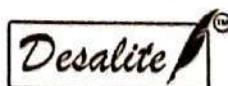

In this context, one of the essential and non-negotiable requirements is to ensure a society which is free from all violence. This means ensuring protection of the rights of women and children on priority. One of the gravest violation and exploitation of women and children is Human Trafficking. Unless the youth is involved in this in preventing and compacting human trafficking, there is no solution in sight. Having realised this important aspect, Dr. P. M. Nair, the renowned international expert on Human Trafficking issues has set up an Anti Human Trafficking Clubs (AHTC) across India starting from 2014. Under his mentorship, during the year 2015, the Department of Sociology and Social Work at CHRIST Deemed to be University, Bangalore, had set up the AHTC. The avowed objectives of the club are the following:

- Create awareness on human trafficking in various forms and issues involved
- Continuing campaign for anti-human trafficking for sustainable results
- Conduct locality specific studies and surveys to understand the micro level issues in depth and provide it as secondary research data and qualitative feedback for macro level studies

- Conduct activities that encourage preventing human trafficking, which is a grave crime and violation of rights and dignity of human beings.
- Share successful models with other institutions and groups through networking for mutual support and sustenance

The Anti-human Trafficking Mission is an initiative of Master of Social work (MSW) students to create a common platform for researchers, scholars, students, leaders, activists, social workers, NGOs, and others to share their experiences and data with contemporaries who are and have been fighting human trafficking in India and abroad. Anti-Human Trafficking Mission started as a service learning by MSW students of CHRIST (Deemed to be University) in 2015 with activities in the campus to spread awareness on ill effects of Human Trafficking and role of students in prevention and control measures. AHTM club members were part of the "National Research on Human Trafficking in India" conducted by National Human Rights Commission in collaboration with Tata Institute of Social Sciences in 2015. The activities started with a Workshop on 'Leadership and motivation' organized in association with International Justice Mission, Bengaluru (IJM) for the students from various colleges in Bengaluru on 25th July 2016. The aim was to encourage students to start 'Anti- Human Trafficking Clubs' in their respective colleges. Student members could reach various PU colleges in Bengaluru city to start AHTM clubs and this is a regular activity of the members from 2016 onwards. AHTM members have held awareness seminars within the campus and have participated in Seminars to prevent Child Trafficking and Training Programs on Human Rights of the Victims of Trafficking organized by The Brothers Integrated Rural Development Society (BIRDS) and National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) in August & December 2017 respectively.

Trafficking is the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harbouring or receipt of people through force, fraud or deception, with the aim of exploiting them for profit. Men, women and children of all ages and from all backgrounds can become victims of this crime, which occurs in every region of the world.

What trafficking really means is girls groomed and forced into sexual exploitation; men tricked into accepting risky job offers and trapped in forced labour in building sites, farms or factories; and women recruited to work in private homes only to be trapped, exploited and abused behind closed doors with no way out. Human trafficking is the third largest crime industry in the world, behind drug dealing and arms trafficking, and is the fastest-growing activity of trans-national criminal organizations.

Trafficked people are held against their will through acts of coercion, and forced to work for or provide services to the trafficker or others. The work or services may include anything from bonded or forced labour to commercial sexual exploitation.

### **Human Trafficking In Numbers**

- 51% of identified victims of trafficking are women, 28% children and 21% men
- 72% people exploited in the sex industry are women
- 63% of identified traffickers were men and 37% women
- 43% of victims are trafficked domestically within national borders

### **How Can Child Trafficking be Prevented in India**

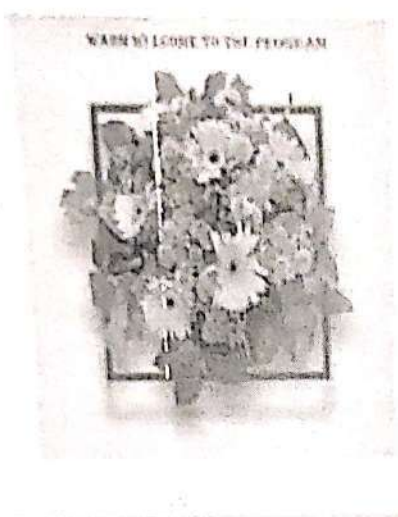
- Spread awareness among parents and communities

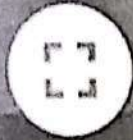

## REPORT ON CORONA AWARENESS A PROGRAMME TO SPREAD AWARENESS ON CORONA

On 02<sup>nd</sup> February 2020 under the guidance of our ANO LT Sampath Kumar. R, 50 NCC cadets were instructed to take part in spreading the awareness about the corona virus the aim was to spread information and methods to avoid corona virus and create awareness to public.

Coronaviruses (CoV) are a large family of viruses that cause illness ranging from the common cold to more severe diseases such as Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS-CoV) and Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS-CoV). A novel coronavirus (nCoV) is a new strain that has not been previously identified in humans.

Coronaviruses are zoonotic, meaning they are transmitted between animals and people.

Detailed investigations found that SARS-CoV was transmitted from civet cats to humans and MERS-CoV from dromedary camels to humans. Several known coronaviruses are circulating in animals that have not yet infected humans.

Common signs of infection include respiratory symptoms, fever, cough, shortness of breath and breathing difficulties. In more severe cases, infection can cause pneumonia, severe acute respiratory syndrome, kidney failure and even death.

Standard recommendations to prevent infection spread include regular hand washing, covering mouth and nose when coughing and sneezing, thoroughly cooking meat and eggs. Avoid close contact with anyone showing symptoms of respiratory illness such as coughing and sneezing.

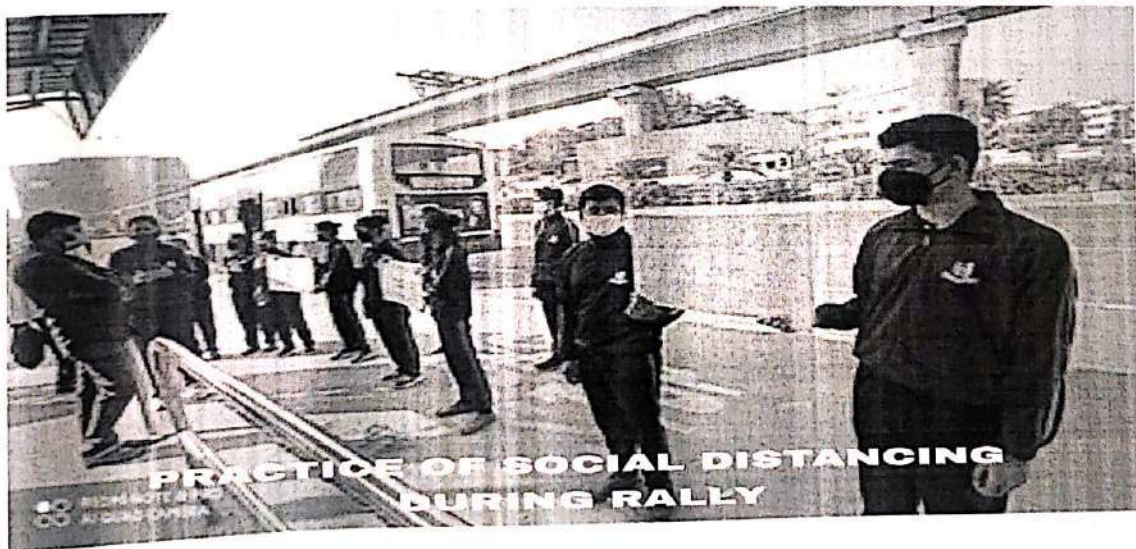

On 24th Nov 2019 Bicycle rally was conducted by Ncc wing of SFS college on account of Ncc day celebration based on the theme 'NCC activities'.

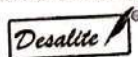

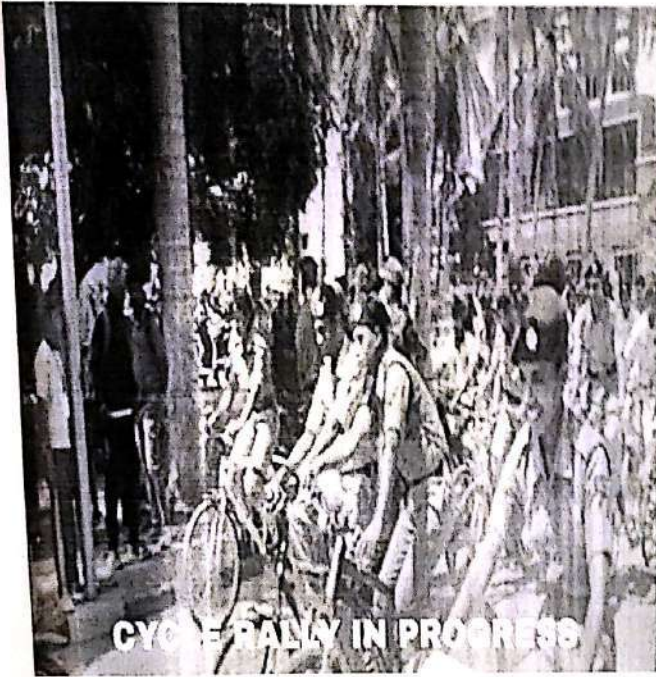

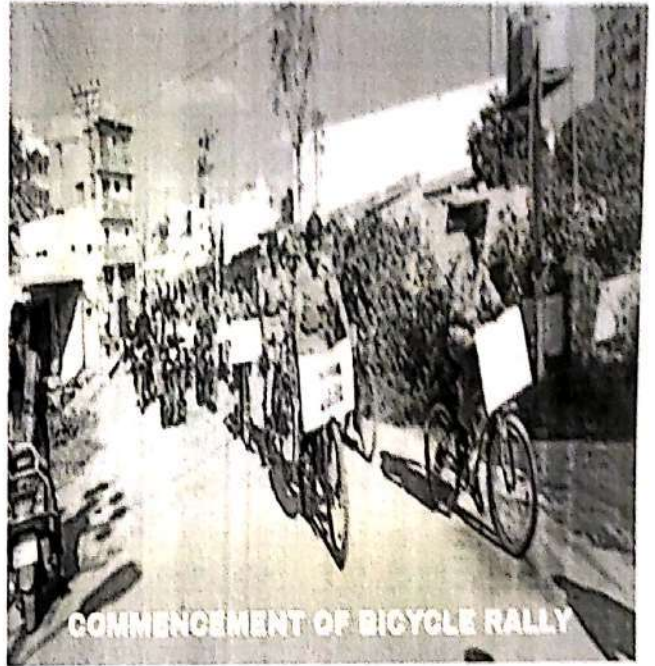

COVID-19 is a disease caused by a new strain of coronavirus. 'CO' stands for corona, 'VI' for virus, and 'D' for disease. Formerly, this disease was referred to as '2019 novel coronavirus' or '2019-nCoV.' The COVID-19 virus is a new virus linked to the same family of viruses as Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) and some types of common cold. The virus is transmitted through direct contact with respiratory droplets of an infected person (generated through coughing and sneezing). Individuals can also be infected from and touching surfaces contaminated with the virus and touching their face (e.g., eyes, nose, mouth). The COVID-19 virus may survive on surfaces for several hours, but simple disinfectants can kill it.

Social distancing is a term that's applied to actions taken by public health officials to stop or slow the spread of a highly contagious disease. Social distancing measures restrict when and where people can gather in order to stop or slow the spread of infectious diseases. Such measures include limiting large groups of people coming together, closing buildings and canceling events, as well as deliberately increasing the physical space between people to avoid contracting an illness. Staying at least 6 feet away from other people lessens your chance of catching this virus.

The COVID-19 pandemic is disrupting every aspect of people's lives in an unprecedented manner. While many of its implications, such as confinement-related psychological distress and social distancing measures, affect all of society, different age groups experience these impacts in distinct ways. With the gradual transition of government responses from immediate crisis management to the implementation of recovery measures, several concerns are emerging, such as increasing levels of youth unemployment and the implications of rising debt for issues of intergenerational justice, as well as threats to the well-being of youth and future generations.

An inclusive response to and recovery from the crisis requires an integrated approach to public governance that anticipates the impact of response and recovery measures across different age cohorts. "Building better" requires decision makers to acknowledge generational divides and address them decisively in order to leave no one behind.

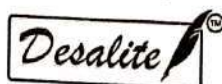
