**Dear Desalites,** I'm happy to share my thoughts with **SAMVADA**, the Newsletter of the Department of Arts of our College. You have chosen a current and socially relevant theme for this issue of the newsletter, i.e., 'Kerala-Coorg floods 2018.' As we all know that Kerala and Coorg are now reeling from its worst natural calamity in over a century. Though Kerala was known all over the world for its spices, green landscapes, backwaters, tea gardens, lovely rivers and lakes, almost three weeks of torrential rain, floods and landslides made over a million people end up in relief camps and over 500 people were reported dead. The oddly high rainfall, increased the dam water to dangerous levels, making the dam authorities open 35 of its 42 dams, thus, 774 of its 1564 villages were underwater.

In Coorg district of Karnataka too, thousands of people have been battered by heavy rain and devastating landslides. Almost 20 people were re-

ported dead and many have lost their houses and cultivations. Both in Kerala and Coorg floods and landslide have damaged thousands of hectors of cultivations, bridges, road networks, rail roads, buildings and industries. Although we believe that the worst is over, the next few months will be about rebuilding houses, roads, bridges, cleaning, scrubbing picking up pieces and moving ahead.

Help and support were pouring in from all parts of the world as the local and government agencies were mobilising money and material to help these victims of floods and landslides. It's a fact that people from all walks of life were contributing with an open heart.

Let me also acknowledge and thank you all for the contribution made from our College to alleviate the sufferings of these e people affected by this natural calamity. Apart from donating cash and goods, our NSS team was also planning to visit some of the relief camps in Coorg to render their services to them.
