Poetry, by its very nature, makes demand on a writer who attempts to analyse it that other forms of literature do not. In order to write an effective creative poem, one needs to have a clear idea of the topic. February 14th is celebrated as Valentine's Day, so as students has clear idea about love from a lover's point of view. But love has many other viewpoints. In poetic view of love, Students were asked to write poems on their creation.

Poem writing competition was conducted on 13th February, 2019 Wednesday for the students of all the departments. The base topic of poetry writing was 'Love'. To write poetry, start by reading poetry. You can do this in a casual way by letting the words of your favourite poems wash over you without necessarily digging for deeper meaning. Or you can delve into analysis.

The experience of consuming poetry does not have to be an academic exercise in cataloguing poetic devices like alliteration and metonymy. It can be musical—such as when you attend a poetry slam for the first time and hear the snappy consonants of a poem out loud. Many bookstores and coffeehouses have poetry readings, and these can be both fun and instructive for aspiring poets. By listening to the sounds of good poetry, discover the beauty of its construction—the mix of stressed syllables and unstressed syllables, alliteration and assonance, a well-placed internal rhyme, clever line breaks, and more.

Poet's aspirants connect with one another via poetry readings and perhaps poetry writing classes. Writers in an artistic community often read each other's work, recite their own poems aloud, and provide feedback on first drafts. Good poetry can take many forms.

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And through a community, you may encounter different forms that vary from the type of poem you typically write—but are just as artistically inspiring. Seek out a poetry group where you can hear different types of poetry, discuss the art form, jot down new ideas, and learn from the work of your peers. A supportive community can help you brainstorm ideas, influence your state of mind as an artist, and share poetry exercises that may have helped other members of the group produce great poetry.

The students were asked to prepare a poem in fourteen lines with a suitable caption. The students can prepare the poem on their creative styles with in the theme and can submit the creative works to Prof Sheeba M and Prof Uma Maheshwari, in charges of the day's event. The selected works shall be published in the department notice boards and the newsletter.

Prof Tison Thomas, Cordinator, Department of English explained the context and theme to the students. Prof Vinshy and Dr Tharani, English, Department of Post-Graduation evaluated the works done by the students and declared the results. The prize won works were published in the department newsletter and the selected works ten works got displayed in the department notice boards.
