The objective of the Program:

In the present era, with the advent of new methodologies in teaching and the way digital and smart learning have made inroads into the field of education, the role of teachers has also greatly evolved over a while. Today, a teacher is faced with the arduous task of keeping him/herself abreast with the latest inventions and strides in the fields of medicine, education, science, art, etc. Upgrading their skills and knowledge from time to time is thus necessary and is an utmost priority today.

A teacher is also an educator. They have the opportunity to make a huge impact on the students, but with this opportunity come many challenges. Maintaining their well-being and being competitive is one of the biggest challenges. It's important not only to speak about challenges but identify and train teachers about ways to deal with challenges. IQAC and Faculty Enrichment Committee in association with Saint Francis de Sales College, organized six days virtual FDP from 22nd to 27th May 2023.

The first day of the program began with the auspicious note of prayer to the almighty and welcoming the dignitaries and the resource persons. The inaugural address was delivered by Rev Dr. Binu Edathumparambil, St. Francis de Sales College, Bengaluru. Father insisted on the need for the teachers to be dynamic and adaptive to the new changes in the educational arena. He compared the teachers to natural pearls and expounded on the need to improve the quality of teaching to strive for excellence.

The resource person on the first day of the FDP was Dr. A.L Calistus Jude Dean, Faculty of Sciences, Kristu Jayanti College, Bengaluru and she deliberated on the topic "Curriculum Design and Development: An Overview". She insisted on the dynamics of a teacher which include humor, positivity, high expectations, consistency, fairness, and flexibility. Curriculum design focuses on the creation of the overall course blueprint, mapping content to learning objectives, including how to develop a course outline and build the course. Each learning objective is met with assessment strategies, exercises, content, subject matter analysis, and interactive activities. Day one came to an end with the vote of thanks proposed by Prof Maya Mathew, IQAC coordinator of SFS College, Bengaluru.



On day 2 , Dr. S. Sabitha Shunmuga Priya as the resource person. On day two she spoke on the topic “Principles and Framework of Curriculum Planning in Higher Education” and carried forward his ideas about The principles of the curriculum are norms, values, moralities, and philosophies that will benefit teachers, students, and the whole education system. The curriculum and instructional strategy are essential components of imparting knowledge to students.

On day 3 , Dr. N Devaki as the resource person. The topic was “Innovative Instructional Strategies to meet OBE”. The resource person elucidated on the evolutionary process of becoming a teacher through learning new things and keeping oneself updated on the new developments in the area of their specialization. He insisted on teachers developing empathetic skills as a teacher needs to don the role of a mentor, counselor, manager, and subject expert as well.

On day 4, Prof. Dr. Krishna Reddy Chittedi spoke on the topic “Curriculum Alignment with Industry Standards and Trends”. The resource person stated that a growth mindset is a desire or the willingness to learn new things. He suggested having activity-based pedagogy for the students, as it will activate both the left and right sides of their brains and aid in the holistic development of the students. He introduced design thinking, a problem-solving approach to the audience and spoke on the benefits of using the approach to learn and unlearn.

The fifth day of the FDP had Dr. R Subhashini, as the resource person and her topic was “Curriculum Design for Promoting Research Oriented Teaching and Learning”. She explained the two pedagogical approaches to learning – the teacher-centric and student-centric approaches and their importance. She pointed out the professional skills required to be an effective teacher, which included commitment, determination, and sense of ownership, adaptability, enthusiasm, empathy, and passion to learn.

The final day of the FDP had Dr. Sunitha Damodar, as the resource person and the topic was “Designing Effective Assessment and Evaluation Strategies for Learning Outcome”. The resource person explained that the thought process of every individual is different and the teacher’s role is to identify the different perspectives of the student. She added a few suggestions to follow for better learning outcomes as Setting shared expectations between students and instructors, helping students learn more effectively, and providing clear direction for educators when making instruction and assessment decisions.



The outcome of the program: Faculty Development Programs focus on enriching knowledge and building skills among teachers. The same has been obtained through Six Days Virtual National Level FDP. Many resource people with their vast experience have made FDP a success in building skills, enlightening, and adding to the knowledge bank of teachers.
