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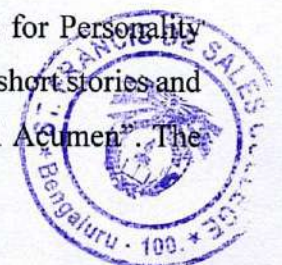
Report:

Teaching, a noble profession is a daunting and challenging task. In the present era, with the advent of new methodologies in teaching and the way digital and smart learning has made inroads into the field of education, the role of teachers has also greatly evolved over a period of time. Today, a teacher is faced with the arduous task of keeping him/herself abreast with the latest inventions and strides in the field of medicine, education, science, art and etc. Upgrading their skills and knowledge from time to time is thus necessary and is an utmost priority today. A teacher is also an educator. They have the opportunity of making a huge impact on the students, but with this opportunity come many challenges. Maintaining their well-being and being competitive is one of the biggest challenge. Its important not only to speak about challenges, but identify and train teachers about ways to deal with challenges. IQAC and Faculty Enrichment Committee in association with Saint Francis de Sales College, Aalo, Arunachal Pradesh organized six days virtual FDP from 11th to 16th July 2022.

The first day of the program began with the auspicious note of prayer to the almighty and welcoming the dignitaries and the resource persons. The inaugural address was delivered by Rev. Dr. Jose Karipadathu, Principal, SFS College, Arunachal Pradesh. Father insisted on the need for the teachers to be dynamic and adaptive to the new changes in the educational arena. He compared the teachers to natural pearls and expounded on the need to improve the quality of teaching to strive for excellence.

The resource person on the first day of the FDP was Rev. Dr. Roy, Principal of St. Francis de Sales College, Bengaluru and he deliberated on the topic "From Passive Receivers to Motivated Learners". Father insisted on the dynamics of a teacher which include humor, positivity, high expectations, consistency, fairness, and flexibility. He explained the types of Cooperative learning which promote critical thinking, deep learning, and social skills and through which the social communities are developed. Day one came to an end with the vote of thanks proposed by Rev. Fr. Jijo Jose, the Vice Principal of SFS College, Bengaluru.

Day 2 and 3 of the FDP had Shri. Anjan Chowdhury, certified Trainer, Skillfinity, Guwahati as the resource person. On day two he spoke on the topic "Reflective Skills for Personality Enhancement" and carried forward his ideas about personal reflection through short stories and his personal experiences. On day three, the topic was "Building Professional Acumen". The



resource person elucidated on the evolutionary process of becoming a teacher through learning new things and keeping oneself updated on the new developments in the area of their specialization. He insisted on teachers developing empathetic skills as a teacher needs to don the role of a mentor, counselor, manager, and subject expert as well.

On day 4, Prof. Sen Mathews, Director, Centre for employability and corporate relations, Kristu Jayanthi College, Bengaluru spoke on the topic “Mindset for Personal and Professional Growth”. The resource person stated that a growth mindset is a desire or the willingness to learn new things. He suggested having activity-based pedagogy for the students, as it will activate both the left and right sides of their brains and aid in the holistic development of the students. He introduced design thinking, a problem-solving approach to the audience and spoke on the benefits of using the approach to learn and unlearn.

The fifth day of the FDP had Prof. Mamatha, Head, Post Graduate Department of Psychology and Consultant, Clinical Psychologist, Crossroads counseling and Training Centre, Bengaluru as the resource person and her topic was “Learn to Teach and Teach to Learn”. She explained the two pedagogical approaches to learning – the teacher-centric and student-centric approaches and its importance. She pointed out the professional skills required to be an effective teacher, which included commitment, determination, sense of owning, adaptability, enthusiasm, empathy, and passion to learn.

The final day of the FDP had Prof. B B Venkatesh, IFIM College, Bengaluru, and a Life Skills trainer, as the resource person and the topic was “Where we stand as a teacher”. The resource person explained that the thought process of every individual is different and the teacher’s role is to identify the different perspectives of the student. He also added that every teacher is a hero and should become the best friend of the students, a lighthouse to guide them, and show neutral support for the students in motivating them to become the best in society.

Positive Outcome: Faculty Development Programs focuses on enriching knowledge and build skills among teachers. The same has been obtained through Six Days Virtual National Level FDP. Many resource people with their vast experience had made FDP a success in building skills, enlightening and adding to the knowledge bank of teachers.
