
Such a powerful artform that emerge from the very soul of the natives needs to be understood by the generation today. Hence, as part of Infinity Lecture 2021, Chaucer's Academy, Department of English organised a lecture on 'Save the old to save the future - Folklore for younger generation.' The resource person for the session was Dr Hemavathi B S from Government First Grade College, Channapatna. She has 16 years of experience in the field of education. Her areas of interest includes Linguistics, Translation, Folklore and Film Studies. She teaches English for undergraduate students and has always been passionate about storytelling. She has worked on folklore fairy-tale and fables in her doctoral research. She has been a part of several workshops on telling stories and shared her thoughts about the same. She has presented papers at national state and international seminars. She was the resource person for the event titled 'The art and the ache of conversing in English' conducted by the Department of English, Sociology and political Science, Govt first grade college Rajajinagar on 10 February 2017. She has also conducted a session on 'Role of theatre in language learning' on 2 February 2016 in the Department of English, Govt first grade college for women, Ramanagar.

Dr. Hemavathi briefed the meaning of Folk lore by tracing its origins to 1846 when the Englishman William Thoms coined the word folk lore. The word was a better replacement for the terms "popular antiquities" or "popular literature". The second half of the word, 'lore,' comes from Old English *lār 'instruction'*. She stated that the concept of folk was earlier limited to rural, poor illiterate peasants. But as newer definitions came up, the perception of earlier definition changed. It stamps a shared identity through distinctive traditions. Social definition of folk supports a broader view of the material, i.e. the lore, considered to be folklore artifacts. These now include all "things people make with words (verbal lore), things they make with their hands (material lore), and things they make with their actions (customary lore)". Folklore is no longer limited to that which is old or obsolete.

The resource person quoted William Bascom who has clearly defined the functions of folklore. According to him Folklore lets people escape from repressions imposed upon them by society, it validates culture, justifying its rituals and institutions to those who perform and observe them, it is a pedagogic device which reinforces morals and values and builds wit and it is a means of applying social pressure and exercising social control.

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She displayed the following images related to folk art:




