As the ability to communicate effectively has become the prerequisite for anyone who ventures into a new profession, the need for developing good communication skill is a muchfelt phenomenon today. The significance of the language lab has been much felt in the domain of communication. The language laboratory helps one to use technology effectively to communicate.

Students need intensive practice on listening and speaking skills in and out of their class rooms as well. The thirst of imparting English language as a skill needs an innovative approach. This approach has been adopted by the college to enable students to have a better mode of learning and improving.

The Language Lab framed a structured outline to be followed by the students in helping them achieve better communication skills. It was conducted on semester wise and includes 5 sessions. The course was handled by the English faculty of our college with the help of the software that was introduced. The language lab offers an exclusive result oriented and efficient way to enrich the English language learning process. The students were introduced to the four aspects of English Language - Listening/ Speaking/ Reading/ Writing. The software helps in faster and easier way of learning. It draws the attention of the individual and it evokes practical learning. The listening module listed a series of audios for the students to listen, analyse and respond. Students were able to work around their listening skills, vocabulary, pronunciation, understanding of the audio, accent, etc. They were made to listen and respond accordingly.

The speaking module encouraged the students to work on their ability to express verbally. The software has enabled them to speak, record and listen to their recordings as well. They were given ideas on compering, different kinds of speeches for an occasion and interview techniques. The Reading module was introduced to help the students in reading and pronunciation. This draws the attention of the students towards improving their reading along with improving their vocabulary. They can listen and follow as it is read in the system. They can also repeat and learn the pronunciation of words.

As part of the course they are also introduced to soft skills which will make them better individuals and encourage them to lead a constructive life. The language lab enables students to learn and practice through innovative communicative methods. This has proved to convenient and has helped students to have new perspective towards sharpening their skills.

- Following are the mainly focused activities in language lab:
 - Teaching Communication and Soft skills Communication: Man is a social


The College encourages the faculty of the English dept to come out with various other activates such as functional grammar, phrasal words to enhance the writing skills and public speaking skills.
