Since research and Innovations are one key aspect of NEP, First three days we had session On IPR, Patent and copyright.


Session-4 "IP Commercialization", detailed on types, importance, Process and different modes of IP commercialization.



- 4. PTM feedback form



Overall it was fruitful interaction with the parents and students



The IQAC Team of Kristu Jayanti College visited our college on 18 February 2022. After a brief discussion with the Management, IQAC Team had an interactive with the IQAC Core Team. They suggested that it's important to set a pattern of functioning and that every member of the College should be empowered and involved in the process of accreditation. Sharing their experience KJC team mentioned that they started their preparation 3 years prior to the year of assessment. It's the duty of the Management to empower the faculty. They mentioned that the staff of KJC follow the work pattern - 30% of time for teaching/evaluation etc, 30% - Research activities, 40%-Documentation and other College work. While discussing about the documentation system, they follow a centralized documentation system with one person as in charge of documentation. Multiple levels of document scrutiny happens and they choose the best as per requirement. A benchmark is set by every criteria in charge at the beginning of the year. The Management ensures that the departments reach the benchmark and they conduct around 600 activities are conducted every year at KJC. As per the Management policy it is mandatory for every faculty to have 2 research publications in a semester at KJC. They explained about the credits added to the Certificate courses offered to the students and that these courses are conducted by faculty by charging a nominal fee. Due to the credit system the college has been able to achieve 100% enrollment and course completion.

The team members discussed about their difficulty in collecting the alumni data which is very essential for NAAC. They expressed that they left no stone unturned to gather this data and employed various mechanisms. Nevertheless, collecting alumni and higher education related data has always been a challenge to all the organizations as mentioned by the experts. They adviced us

that the college should device a mechanism to have collect atleast 50% student data about higher education and alumni. The Expert members suggested that it is important to study SSR of few good colleges to foregather ideas and set benchmarks.

The KJC members later addressed the entire group of faculty members in the closed auditorium. Faculty of our college were eager to hear the experience from the expert team since they had achieved A++ in their accreditation cycle. HoDs and few faculty members had questions about the documentation required for few metrics in NAAC. The team addressed the queries and boosted the confidence of the faculty mentioning that with continued effort and day to day updating of documents will help the institution achieve a better grade in the next cycle.

- Should also nominate and Executive Committee consisting of members from (KSCST. Host institute (Principal/ Secretary/ Treasurers/ Vice chancellor/ Dean/ Head of the departments) IP attorney/ Patent agent & IP cell Coordinator) and an Working Group committee member consisting of the IP cell Coordinator, KSCST, for 2 faculty from each department from St. Francis de Sales College.
- Should allow IP Cell to sensitize and involve the students, faculty, research scholars, and other members and provide awareness and training workshops on IPR periodically.
- Shall allow the IP Cell to identify and drive the innovation to file & commercialize the IPRs from the institutions associated with the host institute.
- Should also allocate or source fund from other agencies for filing, commercialising, Technology transfer and any IPR issues of the host institute

DURATION OF THE MOU

This MOU shall be in effect initially for a period of **3 years** from the date on which this MOU is signed by both the parties and may be renewed thereafter, by mutual consent.
