A Collaborative event with NSS unit of SFS College was organised as a part of Extension Activity by the department of commerce along with the other PG departments on 13th April 2022. The event, Plastic Free Forest was aimed to remove the plastic litter from the forest region. Majority of the students of I- semester were actively involved in this service of removing the plastic wastes to safeguard the animal life.

The event was planned in the forest region, hence prior notice given to the students about this event and consent forms were issued to the students to get the permission from the Parents/Guardians. The notice with all rules and regulation was circulated among the students. There was a session arranged to address the students regarding the safety measures and willingness to be a part of the event. NSS Officer provided the instructions to the volunteers.

The team left the college campus around 8 am. 50 students (10 from Department of Psychology and 1 faculty) and 7 faculty accompanied the students. The destination was reached around 10.30 am. Soon after that, the Regional Forest Officer assembled the students and gave safety instructions and behaviour in the forest range. He warned the students that, if they happen to see any animals, should not make noise and should not tease the animals. Strict instructions given to the students that they should not throw any eatables to the animals.

After that student were segregated into 5 groups for clearing the plastics. Gloves distributed to the students to ensure students safety. First Aid Kit was also carried for the day.

Students were taken to the high forest range and dispersed for the work, about 2 hours they were clearing the bottles, covers and other plastic items. They removed plastic litter and gathered in place to burn them

After the hard physical work around 2 pm Lunch was served to the students, after that We left the place around 3.30 pm and reached the college at 5 pm.

Positive Outcome:

The clear impact of plastic litter is felt on wild life. Plastic bags, once ingested, cannot be digested by an animal so it stays in the gut which prevent food digestion and can lead to very slow and painful death to wild animals. Wild life helps in maintain the eco-logical balance of nature. Killing of carnivores leads to an increase in the number of herbivores which in turn affect the forest vegetations thus due to lack of food in the forest they come out from the forest to agriculture land and destroy our crops. students expressed gratitude for the college, that they got an opportunity to be part of wonderful initiative.
